HISPANO MARKET

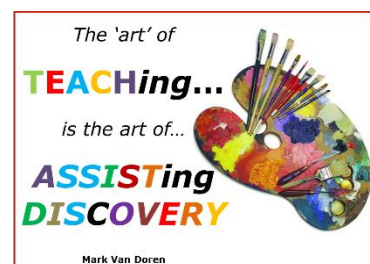
